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### **RE Official Information Act request CDHB 10136**

I refer to your email dated 2 July 2019 requesting the following information under the Official Information Act from Canterbury DHB, regarding expectant mothers and/or newborn babies who are transferred to out of town DHBs and the reason for the transfer.

#### For the past three years, broken down by year:

# 1. How often have expectant mothers and/or newborn babies been transferred to DHBs outside Canterbury?

Please refer to **Appendix 1 Table one** (attached below) which provides the year and month by month detail of how many mothers have been transferred outside Canterbury to birth since March 2015.

#### 2. Why were they transferred:

The mothers were transferred to another DHB to birth because the Neonatal Unit was at or over capacity.

#### 3. Where were they transferred to?

Most of the units the mothers were transferred to were able to provide tertiary care for the baby postdelivery. However, there were times when it was recognised that secondary care would be all that was required so were transferred to DHB's such as Nelson, Palmerston North and Timaru. #### 4. Were any transferred to Australia?

No, there were no expectant mothers and/or newborn babies transferred to Australia.

#### 5. Can you please tell me the occupancy rates for your neonatal wards over the past three years?

Over the past three years the occupancy rate for the neonatal service has averaged 102%. Frequently over 105% and at times sitting at 125%
