I refer to your email dated 17 August 2022 requesting the following information under the Official Information Act from Waitaha Canterbury. Specifically:

• Since 2010, how many pregnancies in the district have been terminated after a scan for fetal anomalies/birth defects? Displayed by year.

The Christchurch Gynaecology Procedure Unit at Christchurch Women's Hospital performs terminations for the Canterbury region and for West Coast residents where the pregnancy is more than 12 weeks and 1 day. The number of women who have had a surgical termination following a scan for fetal anomalies/birth defects since 2010 with a clinical code for:

- Maternal care for known or suspected fetal abnormality and damage or
- Maternal care for other known or suspected fetal problems.
