

RE Official Information Act request CDHB 10181

I refer to your email dated 2 September 2019 sent to the Ministry of Health which they subsequently partially transferred to us on 11 September 2019 requesting the following information under the Official Information Act from Canterbury DHB regarding the HPV vaccine. I note we are responding to Questions 1, 2 and 3, specifically:

If possible, it would be great to get this information by year so that I can demonstrate how the adoption rate has changed.

- 1. The number of schools offering the vaccine over the past ten years (2009-2019)
- 2. The number of women who received the vaccine in schools over the past ten years
- 3. The number of women who received the vaccine outside of schools over the past ten years

Canterbury DHB only implemented a school based HPV vaccination programme in 2014. Between 2009 and 2013 the Canterbury DHB opted to provide HPV vaccination through a General Practice delivered programme.
