How is the government's \$79 million being spent at Hillmorton hospital?

- 1. Can the CDHB provide all correspondence to do with Hillmorton hospital staff and or the CDHB and The Ministry of Health including Minister David Clark in the last two years to do with this.**

Please note We have redacted information pursuant to section 9(2)(a) of the Official Information Act i. e. *"...to protect the privacy of natural persons, including that of deceased natural persons."* We have also redacted information which is 'Out of Scope' of your request.

- 2. A breakdown of how the money is being spent from the allocated \$79 million**

The allocated \$79M is being spent on construction of two new buildings at the Hillmorton campus to allow remaining Specialist Mental Health Services currently operating from The Princess Margaret Hospital to relocate to Hillmorton following completion.

- 3. How much money is going into extra staff and nurses at Hillmorton hospital?**

None, as the allocated \$79M is for the cost of construction only. The Specialist Mental Health Services currently operating from The Princess Margaret Hospital are already staffed. Existing staff will transfer to Hillmorton with the transfer of the Services in due course.

Canterbury DHB thrilled with announcement of funding for new facilities

Thursday 28/2/2019



Canterbury DHB Chief Executive David Meates, has welcomed today's announcement from the Prime Minister of around \$79 million to fund the construction of two new facilities for some of the region's Specialist Mental Health Services.

"These services are currently located in outdated buildings at The Princess Margaret Hospital site, and I'm thrilled they will be moving to modern new facilities at Hillmorton.

“The demand for Canterbury’s mental health services has continued to grow in line with predictions based on international post-disaster research. Over the past eight years, our specialist mental health services have been challenged by more people needing our help than we have physical space for – and our ageing facilities are no longer fit for purpose. This has created ongoing issues.”

“Our staff are supporting 700 more people every month in our adult general mental health service than pre-quake, and 450 more people every month in our Child and Youth mental health service.

“In the past year 32,341 people received mental health support from across our health system. Almost half of this group have required our specialist mental health services in the past year. This equates to 3893 children and adolescents along with 9899 adults and 2419 older people accessing our mental services. This high demand has put considerable strain on our existing facilities and on staff delivering and managing our mental health services.

“I am thrilled with today’s important funding announcement. It gives the go-ahead for two multipurpose buildings – an Integrated Family Services Centre including purpose-designed facilities to meet the needs of the Mothers & Babies service and Eating Disorders inpatients, and a separate High and Complex Needs Unit.

“This provides a welcome boost for our specialist mental health services staff, many of whom will be relocated from The Princess Margaret Hospital into these new purpose-built facilities. It’s also a boost for our patients, both local and regional, who will benefit from the improved services these new facilities will bring.

“These two buildings will be the first steps in a full remodelling of the Hillmorton campus – a process which will, over the coming years, transform our mental health services. With 1 in 5 Cantabrians accessing mental health support, this funding and the new facilities it provides can only be seen as positive news for the wellbeing and mental health of Cantabrians,” David Meates said.

New mental health facilities for Hillmorton in Christchurch

Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern and Health Minister David Clark have announced additional funding for the construction of new specialist mental health facilities at Canterbury DHB's Hillmorton campus.

The Government has approved \$79 million for the project, which will see mental health services currently housed at The Princess Margaret Hospital relocated to Hillmorton. These include services for mothers and babies, as well as child, adolescent and family inpatient services and adults with high and complex needs.

"Mental health has been a priority for this Government since day one. Part of that is ensuring that we have quality facilities that reflect modern methods of care. We want to create physical environments that support people's treatment and recovery," Jacinda Ardern said.

"In our first Budget we set aside \$750 million for capital projects (the largest capital injection in Health in at least a decade) including upgrading mental health facilities in the interests of both staff and patients.

"This development will create a modern, flexible environment for mothers and their families, children and adolescents. It will include access to the outdoors and green spaces and will be a massive improvement on the current facilities at the ageing Princess Margaret site," Jacinda Ardern said.

Health Minister David Clark said today's announcement is a further sign of the Government's commitment to tackling problems in the mental health sector.

"There's no question that as a country we can do better to support mental health and wellbeing in our communities. The need has been particularly evident in Canterbury as people live day-to-day with the legacy of earthquakes.

"The current mental health facilities at Princess Margaret are tired and far from ideal. Relocating these family mental health services to new, purpose built buildings will make a real difference to patients and the dedicated staff that care for them.

"Of course buildings and specialist services are only part of the picture when it comes to addressing mental health and wellbeing. As the Inquiry into Mental Health and Addiction made clear we need to put people at the centre of our mental health response, intervene early and support wellbeing in our communities at every level.

"That is the approach that will drive the Government's response to the Inquiry to be announced next month. In the meantime, I'm pleased we are getting on with the job of improving mental health facilities and services," said David Clark.

Background:

The new facilities, with a floor area of 7,880 square metres, will contain an Integrated Family Service Centre with a 16 bed inpatient and day patient child, adolescent and family service, and a 13 bed and 5 to 7 cot space for mothers and babies as well as eating disorders inpatient and outpatient services.

A separate High and Complex Unit will include 16 inpatient adult beds for a range of treatment options including long term, and intensive rehabilitation.

The Indicative Business case for the project estimated the cost at \$57-million. The budget was increased to \$79-million when it became clear there was a need for more space for mothers and their families, and also flexible spaces for children and adolescents.

Management of the redevelopment project will sit with Canterbury DHB. This is in line with similar DHB infrastructure projects across the country. There will be oversight by the Ministry and the Hospital Redevelopment Partnership Group.

The location of the Child, Adolescent and Family outpatient service will be progressed separately by the DHB. It is standard practice in other DHBs for these services to be based in a different location within the community.

Other Government initiatives and investments in mental health (excluding the Inquiry into Mental Health and Addiction):

- In February 2018 the Mana Ake programme was launched, putting mental health support in primary and intermediate schools in Christchurch and Kaikoura
- In Budget 2018 the nurses in schools programme was extended to cover all decile 4 secondary schools
- Also in Budget 2018, DHB funding for mental health and addiction services was boosted by \$200 million over four years



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Talking points for David Meates – Mental Health Funding announcement

Mihi

Tena kotou and welcome to our Prime Minister, the Rt Honourable Jacinda Ardern, and to the Minister of Health, the Honourable Dr David Clark.

A warm welcome to Megan Woods, Minister for Greater Christchurch Regeneration, MP Ruth Dyson and other MPs here today.

[FYI We also invited: Duncan Webb, Poto Williams & Rino Tirikatene – haven't heard from them]

Aroha Metcalf is here representing the Ministry of Health's Deputy Director General of Mental Health

Welcome too, to our invited guests which includes staff, consumers, and those with an involvement in this exciting project.

First, a thank-you.

Thank you Prime Minister for announcement of funding that will allow us to create new purpose-designed facilities. These two new buildings are going to make the world of difference to both patients and staff for many years to come.

And to the Minister, thank you for your kind words about the work of everyone here today.

The demand for our specialist mental health services has continue to grow in line with the predictions based on international post-disaster research.

Our specialist mental health services have been challenged by more people needing our help than we have physical space for – and our ageing facilities are no longer fit for purpose. This has created ongoing issues for patients, staff, and those managing the service.

For our staff, this means they are supporting 700 more people every month in our adult general mental health service than pre-quake, 450 more people every month in our Child and Youth mental health service and, in the emergency department, the number of mental health Crisis Assessments carried out has increased from 58 to 125 each month.

In the past year 32,341 people received mental health support from our health system - either District Health Board specialist services, or community-based Non-Government Organisations or primary health services.

Almost half of this group (16,300 people) have required specialist mental health services in the past year with 3893 children and adolescents along with 9899 adults and 2419 older people being supported.

With 1 in 5 Cantabrians accessing mental health support, nearly every household within Canterbury will have or know someone who has lived experience of mental health problems.

The proposed developments at Hillmorton are the timely beginnings of a larger masterplan for the whole campus.

The new buildings will bring previously "stranded" services across from The Princess Margaret Hospital: the local and regional Specialist Mental Health Services (SMHS) including Mothers and Babies, South Island Eating Disorders and Child and Adolescent inpatients and outpatients, as well as a High and Complex needs unit.

The larger masterplan, at this preliminary stage, creates a series of connected precincts across the campus. A mix of new and upgraded/refurbished buildings, the masterplan concepts include:

- an adult inpatient precinct including a significant upgrade of the existing Te Awakura facility
- a family inpatient precinct
- an adult outpatient precinct
- a family outpatient precinct
- rehabilitative spaces
- administrative and support services.

I'm thrilled that we have some positive news for our community, for our mental health patients and their whanau, and importantly, for our staff, who will all benefit from these new facilities in the years to come.

Thank you Prime Minister and Minister for taking the time to visit us here today.

I'm Toni Gutschlag, General Manager for Mental Health in Canterbury

This announcement is a tremendous boost to specialist mental health services and our community.

It's a particularly positive for the staff who will be relocated from The Princess Margaret Hospital to this campus into contemporary purpose-built facilities, and provides them new sense of certainty that their roles and their skills and responsibilities are valued.

It also marks the first steps in a remodelling of the Hillmorton campus – a process which will, over the coming years, transform many of our mental health facilities.

Most importantly it's a boost for our patients and their families – from Canterbury and across the South Island – who will benefit from the professionalism and the painstaking planning that's been put into creating these facilities.

Essentially we have been in a holding pattern since the earthquakes, with all the attendant uncertainty and stress that this situation brings. I want to acknowledge the absolute professionalism and dedication of our staff who have continued to provide excellent services in the most trying of circumstances. You have done our community and our organisation proud. I want to acknowledge the consumers and families who continue to access services and put their trust and confidence in us and in our people. Our environment and buildings do not and have not honoured our Kaupapa or mahi, they do not accurately reflect the value and worth of mental health services.

The new facilities for the Eating Disorders Service, Mothers & Babies Service, High and Complex needs unit, and Child and Adolescent inpatient services are going to strengthen and enhance our contemporary models of care through contemporary environmental design. They will greatly enhance the therapeutic dynamic.


More than 700 consumers use the PMH based services each year, and more than 170 staff work in these services. That is a lot of people and families who, every year and for years to come, will directly benefit from the important announcement made today.

Christchurch mental health services announcement

Prime Minister's Speech

I'm very pleased to be here today with my colleague, Minister of Health Dr David Clark, to announce some significant progress towards new mental health facilities for people here in Canterbury.

Firstly, I'd like to acknowledge last week's eighth anniversary since the devastating 22nd February earthquakes.

I know you have faced some incredibly tough challenges as Canterbury recovers from the quakes, while you have continued your excellent work in supporting your community's wellbeing.

I want to thank you all for your important contribution to your community, particularly because the quakes have had far-reaching impacts on your community's health needs, on health services, and on yourselves as individuals.

I know that mental health continues to be a significant issue for Cantabrians, and there is a need for modern mental health facilities.

The Princess Margaret Hospital's buildings aren't fit for purpose for Canterbury's specialist mental health services, and key infrastructure repairs have not been carried out since 2012. [the essential repairs have been carried out]

People with mental health needs deserve modern facilities that are fit for purpose to ensure the best outcomes for people, and the staff who care for them also deserve modern facilities to work in, enabling them to offer high quality care.

Today's blessing here at Hillmorton Hospital recognises a key step forward in improving Canterbury's mental health facilities.

It's my pleasure today to announce that the Government has approved the Detailed Business Case for new high quality mental health facilities here at Hillmorton Hospital, relocating the majority of mental health services from The Princess Margaret Hospital.

With an increased budget of about \$79 million, this project is an important step towards enabling you to better serve the needs of your community in the future.

Delivering new facilities is just part of the work this Government is doing to fix the problems in the health sector and in mental health.

Two weeks ago, I spoke at the opening of Parliament about the Government's long term blue-print for a better New Zealand – building a productive, sustainable economy that works for everyone and is fit for the 21st Century, improving the wellbeing of all New Zealanders and their families, and taking a new approach to leadership, focusing on long term issues.

We're committed to building a nation where people feel healthy, safe and happy in their homes and wider communities, by improving access to affordable, quality healthcare, overhauling our mental health services and reducing crime.

I know Dr Clark is going to tell you more about the He Ara Oranga, the report into the Government Inquiry into Mental Health and Addiction, which we received last November.

While it's too soon to give more details, I can say that addressing mental health will be a priority in this year's Budget.

So before I hand over to Dr Clark, I want to thank you for inviting me here today to share this important step towards improving Canterbury's mental health services. I look forward to hearing more about this project's progress.

Minister of Health Dr David Clark's speech

Mihi

I must say it's great to be back in Christchurch to announce progress on further new health facilities for your community, especially so soon after I officially opened the Christchurch Outpatients Building less than four weeks ago.

It's a pleasure to be here alongside Prime Minister Jacinda Adern to share with you this important step towards delivering better mental health facilities for Canterbury.

This new project is part of the \$750 million that the Government put aside in last year's Budget for capital expenditure to improve the state of our hospitals and health facilities.

I know this project is very important for your community and for those of you who work in mental health services.

Following work on the Indicative Business Case, which estimated these new

facilities would cost up to \$57 million, it became clear more space was needed for mothers and their whānau, and also flexible spaces for children and adolescents. That's why we agreed to increase the project's budget to approximately \$79 million.

These new fit-for-purpose facilities will have an Integrated Family Service Centre with a 16-bed inpatient and day-patient child, adolescent and family service, and space for 13 beds plus 5 to 7 cots for mothers and babies, as well as eating disorders inpatient and outpatient services.

A separate High and Complex Unit will include 16 [not 24] inpatient adult beds for a range of treatment options, including long term and intensive rehabilitation.

Construction of the new facility is anticipated to get underway in the third quarter of next year (2020), and services will start operating there by the end of 2022.

The DHB will manage this project, which is in line with similar DHB infrastructure projects across the country, and it will have oversight by the Ministry of Health and the Hospital Redevelopment Partnership Group.

I understand the DHB will separately progress where it will locate the Child, Adolescent and Family outpatient service. It's standard practice around New Zealand for these services to be based in different buildings, and usually in more central locations to improve patient access and attendance.

I also understand that the DHB has prioritised ~~started site planning work to develop a business case for a new acute adult inpatient unit. , which will be followed by service planning and foundational work to develop a business case.~~

Improving the state of our health facilities and improving our country's mental health services are two of my key priorities.

As the Prime Minister mentioned, the Government received He Ara Oranga - the report of the Government Inquiry into Mental Health and Addiction last November.

We expect to formally respond by the end of March, which gives us time to take important decisions in time for our Wellbeing Budget in May.

It is important we make services easier to access for all New Zealanders, and particularly for Māori and Pacific people. Reshaping our approach to mental health and addiction is no small task. While some things can be addressed relatively quickly, many of the issues we are facing, such as workforce shortages will take years to fully address.

The Government has pushed ahead with a number of initiatives while the Inquiry conducted its work. For example, the Mana Ake programme, which is putting mental health support in primary and intermediate schools in Christchurch and Kaikoura. We've also extended the nurses in schools programme to cover all public decile 4 secondary schools.

Budget 2018 also included a major funding boost of \$200 million, over four years, for mental health services provided by DHBs.

I want to wish you all the very best for this exciting project as it progresses. I look forward to returning to Christchurch to celebrate the continued progress on the

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projects here. The new \$483m Acute Services Building, to be known as Christchurch Hospital 'Hagley' is on track to be completed later this year. We are also progressing a new Energy Centre and the Hospital Redevelopment Programme business case.

I know that our continued investment in Canterbury makes a real difference to the people who live here and who rely on the DHB to provide accessible, quality health services that people need and deserve.

Thank you for inviting us here today.

Throughout concept design, user group engagement meetings were held with each clinical service. Representatives from the clinical teams, facility project team, family liaison and service users were on all of the user groups. The involvement of consumers' family and Maori in all aspects of the design right from the start (co- design) was an integral feature of the planning.

Aspects of the design have been mocked-up and tested by staff, patients and family – as an example: bedroom mock-ups were built in the TPMH chapel.

Another key innovation is the collection of videoed “patient stories” which will be available to architects, user groups and design teams. This has enabled wider consultation and involvement of consumers and family, supporting their wishes and hopes for the service.

The design of the buildings is intended to empower and enable service users and their whanau to take part in all aspects of care and recovery.

The inpatient units are a “single loaded corridor” model (rooms on one side of a corridor only) arranged around internal courtyards.


- These provide a feeling of sanctuary.
- Bedroom privacy is maximised, with no exterior usable space outside the bedroom windows.
- The courtyard provides a naturally secure environment without the need for fences.
- It allows users to observe and engage in activities to a level they are comfortable with.
- A greater sense of security in an unfamiliar environment helps users to manage stress.

The courtyards improve safety and security for users and staff, with observation possible across the unit from different positions.

The design offers spaces for activities including recreation, access to fitness equipment where appropriate, occupational therapy spaces and group rooms for small or large group activities such as music, relaxation or mindfulness.

In addition there is also provision for regular aspects of daily living such as a therapeutic bathroom, kitchenettes and laundries.

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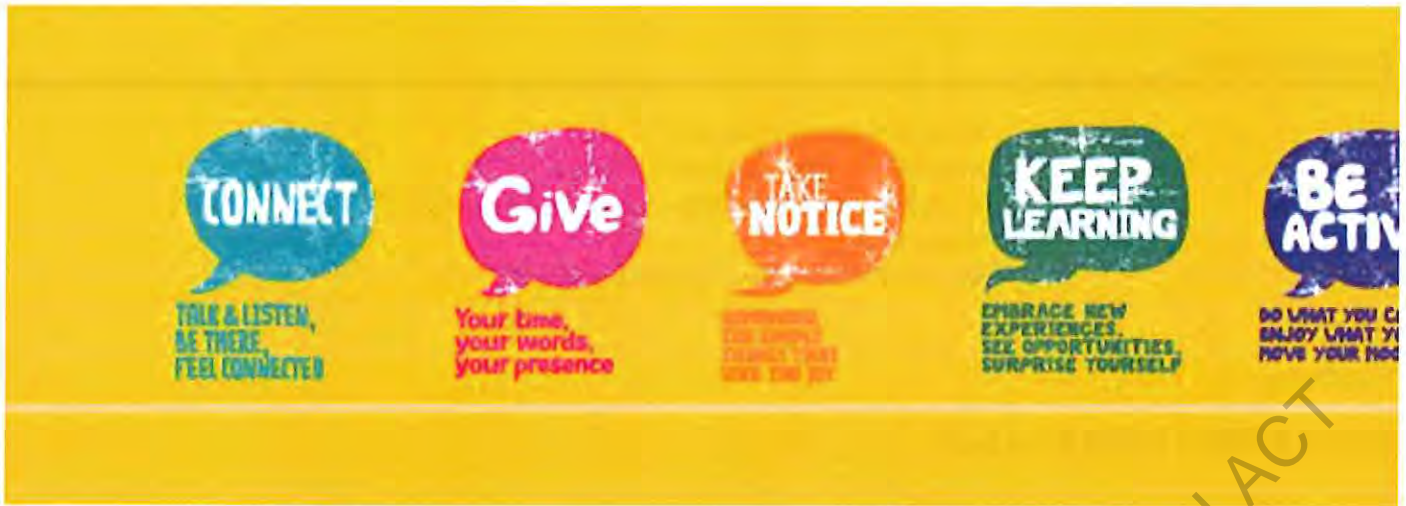

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

We can't comment on the details of the Detailed Business Case at this stage. As the Minister said last month, an announcement is expected early in the new year.


